Forum Nature area Signage

- Tom to send out draft signs next week for comments.
- Include language addressing the algae that is visible.
- Consider placing sign for level lip near concrete trail, or dedicate mowed path to location closer to the lip.

• Future Level Spreader Sites

- Tom to provide sketch demonstrating scalability to Action Team to be forwarded to Science Team
- Could put level spreaders in suite of BMPs in upcoming Hinkson Watershed Management Plan
- Sean Zeiger's studies might help inform recommendations.
- May need to think about salt laden runoff with respect to BMPs that infiltrate
 - Inadvertently creating salt sink that makes problems later in year worse?
 - Salt grass remediation might help.
 - Create soil storage areas for salt free runoff to help ameliorate effects of salt migrating through watershed in warm seasons?
 - City Sustainability Office to be looking at uses for bio-char. Might it help with salt remediation?

Next Steps

Chlorides

Lynne suggested setting up a task force to help move forward with chloride recommendations

- Ask experts from partners' ice-fighting groups (i.e. Street Departments) to attend.
- Experts might help determine how to approach private property owners and applicators.
- Invite private applicators to be involved in task force through press release and targeted mailings.

Should regulations regarding chloride application be brought forward?

- May be better to focus Education and Outreach on chlorides for a time before making new rules
- Geosyntec study results should help convince some folks
- Provide recognition to folks doing the right thing
