A discussion ensued about whether it was reasonable for this committee to evaluate the Storm water management practices currently being utilized whether in the Hinkson or not, because we are asking people to do that. As an example, the detention ponds at Battle High School are designed to hold water and they surround the outdoor fields where the public attends events. These facilities draw mosquitoes and are a potential health problem. It was explained that until the flora is established in these basins the mosquito population could be a problem. Since everything the CAM is recommending must be flexible to see if it works or doesn't this might be appropriate. It would be good to know that something is not working as expected. It is a good idea to reexamine that policy because it is not a perfect science and it's flawed if it doesn't work. We should be looking at BMP's and see what is working especially in areas along the Hinkson.

- Hot Spots Review and Updates from Action Team-Erin Keys

Home Depot Bio-retention basin is still being evaluated. This is by Marks Mobile Home Park. There is a road planned to go through the area across from the Hinkson that would go through the BMP. We might want to think about if we do Bio retention that we do put mosquito stuff that kills the larvae. Vandiver, Sylvan, and Calvert Drives are in the City capital improvement plan for Stormwater problems and water quality work. Major improvements needed there.

It was requested the Committee keep the 30 Acre Altis property on the Radar.
